Novice/New Growers' Report

The Novice New Growers Group met again in the Townsville Orchid Society Inc. Hall at Charles Street, Kirwan on the 27th June with 53 members and 6 visitors in attendance for the afternoon activities. Several of the visitors are showing a lot of interest in our activities, also some of the newer members are taking advantage of the library and talking to our librarian Noel, who is always on hand to help them.

The benching of your orchid plants for our Winter Show was the main topic for discussion and it is very essential to present your plants to their best advantage for judging. Always place your plants in the best position for the flower buds to develop mainly accordingly to the light and plant habit also it is best to stake the flower inflorescences when they are small. About 150mm, is the right hight on a Phalaenopsis spike. It is important for the control of pests especially thrips, aphids and mealy bug as they will damage the flower buds when guite small which will then cause disfigurement in the flowers when they open. Botrytis fungus is another problem when the nights are cool, humidity is high and there is poor air circulation. Affected flowers will develop unsightly speckles on the petals and sepals. A senior member Ray Robinson was kind enough to bring along a Coelogyne plant in flower which he described its many aspects in detailed, especially the single flower on a very long raceme. Thanks again Ray for your generous help.

With so many overcast days there was still a lovely show of stunning blooms on display and in the Novice Popular Vote Section it was Janeen Deliseo 1st, Col Bergenski & Lyn Mulch 2nd and Jan Hendrick 3rd. The Open Section Michael & Lyn Gudge was 1st, Steven Fay 2nd and Mavis Papalexion 3rd. A few of our members have been enjoying a holiday lately Doris Blakeney and Noelene LeRoy are down at the Gold Coast and Margaret Locke is on an overseas holiday. Our thoughts and best wishes go out to all our members who are not in the best of health at the present time, so we hope and trust there are better days ahead for everybody in the future.

At our July meeting we would like the members to bring along the Fertiliser Products that you use, a sample of the fertilizer mixture (small bottle) that you spray on the orchid plants also a small bottle of tap water (please put your name on each item) so that we can analyse the pH. reading and the consistency strength of the fertilizer mixture.

Singapore and the World Orchid Conference 2011

he list of people showing interest in our planned adventure next year is growing all the time, and stretches from Ingham through Townsville to Gladstone. If I was to say the numbers are heading towards 20 I would not be exaggerating too much. If you are interested, then feel free to let me know, whether you are a TOS member or not.

To get to Singapore, and back, we will have to fly. One of the aspects of flying that causes problems is just how much luggage can you take on board. Here is a bit of information from Janelle Paton at Escape Travel, Willows.

"A little info for Luggage and the airlines.

The amount of luggage you can check in for your international flight varies depending on your airline of choice, frequent flier memberships, and other factors. The general rule of thumb for flights to Singapore is 20kgs per person based on economy class of travel. Qantas have a limit of 23kgs per person with the total dimensions not exceeding 270cm (106in) with no 1 piece exceeding 158cm (62in). In addition to your checked in luggage allowance you are generally allowed to a limit of 7kgs of carryon baggage."

Which raises the question, "How do we get all those flasks we purchase back home?"

Planning must also involve health issues, especially immunisations. As Alison and I planned for our forthcoming cruise out into the Pacific Ocean we were advised by the cruise line to be immunised for influenza (seasonal, including of course the swine variety), Hepatitis A and Tetanus/Diphtheria. On taking advice from medical advisors we also were jabbed for typhoid, as we were heading to Vanuatu, and hepatitis B. The Hep B is a course of three injections over a six month period. So our, being non-medical people, advice to you is to discuss your immunisation requirements with your GP the next time you visit, and do not leave it to the last month.

What to bring to the meeting on Sunday.

There will be a small segment on water and fertilisers at this meeting. Warren and I will have "magic" meters to measure some features of your water and fertiliser solution. To make this session more successful you need to follow the following.

Before you come to the novice / new growers' meeting this Sunday afternoon you will need to mix up some of the fertiliser you normally put on your orchids and then collect some, half a cup, in a clean bottle.

Please bring the following to the novice / new growers' meeting this Sunday afternoon (as well as afternoon tea and raffle

- prizes and smiles and growing competition plants and).
- 1. Half a cup of the ordinary water you water your orchids with.
- 2. Half a cup of one of your fertiliser solutions, mixed up as you would pour on your orchids. You may bring more than one type if you wish.
- 3. The list of ingredients on your fertiliser packet. Bring the packet if you wish.
- 4. Something to write with.
