#### **Tony reported that:**

- Lots of issues have needed to be dealt with since we last used the Hall in November. Air conditioning, plumbing, electricity, pest control and other issues.
- Pest control booked for Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> February at 8.00am. Jan to open up for them to spray.
- Clean- up will be done the weekend before that Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> February. Do it in teams. Made a list of the jobs to be done and get groups to do it quicker. Tony and Troy organising that. and we will need to move the things back into the back room out of the Hall. Ask for help on Tuesday morning 4<sup>th</sup> February to move things back.
- Need to contact the Council regarding the gates between the buildings. Jan to do this.

- Tony has requested a quote to change lighting to LED.
- A request has been made for repairs to the hall from a handyman. Water damage. Need to repair the hinges on the folding door.
- Quote from plumber
- A cleaning contractor has been contacted. She has agreed to once a month (after each meeting).
- The kitchen dishwasher has been serviced finished apparently in excellent condition.
- Exterior lights are possibly causing the circuit breaker to break down.
- Weather strips to be added to the outside doors.
- Cleaners room notice required DO NOT CLOSE THIS DOOR.

## Air conditioners.

• Rosters for the Autumn Show are being passed around. Please consider helping.

• There are posters advertising the Show at the front of the Hall if anyone wants to take some to put around the town.

Hall: Tony Kapcelovich and Troy McGill

There has been lots of action with regards to maintenance of the Hall.

- Pest inspection organised to be done on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> February. We need volunteers to move everything into the middle of the Hall in preparation Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> February at 9.00am. have anyone who would like to volunteer to help with the clean up.
- Plumbing received a quote for flexible hoses to be changed
- Lights asked for a quote to change the lights for the Hall and back room.
- Building quote replace rotten timber, broken louvres and add weather strips to the outside doors.
- Kitchen dishwasher slab has been redone and the dishwasher serviced.
- We continue to have issues with the coin dispenser for the air-conditioning in the main hall. Requested air-conditioning company to source a better-quality coin dispenser (Australian made)
- Issues with air-conditioners not turning off. When installed, a component was left out.
- Issues with the toilet blocking up. Needed a plumber.

Tony and a friend looked at our electricity bill and determined that the income we received from the coin machine satisfactorily covers the cost of electricity and maintenance required on the air-conditioning.

#### **General Business:**

**Hall Clean** – This year we are going to have a Hall clean prior to the hall being sprayed for pests, so Saturday 1st of February at 9am, can you please bring some cleaning items, a bucket, cloth etc. Sprayed on Monday and Tuesday the 4th we will reorganise the hall at 9 am put items back.

**Calendar** – Clash with Rockhampton so we will be moving the Spring Shows dates to ensure sellers like Alice can attend. Changed to 19th to 21st September.

**Autumn Show –** April is approaching already and again we will ask for volunteers and donations for the kitchen.

**Herbert River Field Day (Ingham)** – Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> April – week after the Show. The club will heavily subsidise the cost of the bus, with a decision made that we will only charge \$20 per person. Please be aware the cost of the lunch will come from the Herbert River Orchid and Plant Association. It was \$12 last year, and we're assuming that this will remain the same but we will have to wait and see. Consider coming along as it is a great day.

**Technical Report**: Jeff Knowles

Jeff spoke on how to prepare our plants for the upcoming Show. A leaflet called 'Showtime' was distributed with valuable information on it.

Firstly, he emphasised the need to have clean leaves when exhibiting plants. Clean leaves, but do not use White Oil or artificially shine them as they would be disqualified.

Secondly, TOS requires name tags on exhibited plants– green, so that it doesn't distract from the plant and it stops stewards and members of the public digging into the plant to find the label. Also helps that if they like that plant, members of the public can take a photo of the label and make enquiries about it. Much better if printed on the computer, otherwise, clear neat printing would be appreciated. Number on the back of the label – for scribing.

Thirdly, Jeff discussed the importance of presentation of the plant. You want your plant to look at the judges, look them in the eye and the say 'Judge me.' To get them to face the way you want to, you need to stake them early so that they stand upright and look straight out. It's too late to try to stake it up on the day of the show. Take care using clips that they are not too tight on the plant. Some people use small pieces of wire instead. Make sure, once staked, you put the flower facing the same direction if you move it. Some run wire all around

the plant, bringing the pseudobulbs up and the flowers sitting upright. Question from the floor: Is it legal? Jeff recommended that you read the Show Rules on the Show Schedule – there are different rules for different Clubs. Know the local rules to know what is allowed or not allowed. (For our Shows, this can be done by checking the Show Schedule on our website.)

## Presentation: Troy McGill 'Orchid Society 2025'

Troy went through information about the Society, reintroducing Committee members and members who hold other key positions. He went through Show dates then explained the process which we follow at the Sunday meeting.

He explained the rules (by-laws) that relate to exhibiting plants at meetings and specific rules (by-laws) for exhibiting plants at the Shows. These can be found on our website. He also went through the rules regarding selling plants at our Shows.
